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## 1 OVERALL INFORMATION

### 1.1 INTRODUCTION

This manual contains all the information you need to know for proper use and normal maintenance of the **MEKFARMER150** (hereinafter also called "machine"), produced by BREVIGLIERI S.P.A. of Nogara (VR) Italy, hereinafter also called «manufacturing company». The statements herein do not constitute a complete description of the various parts, nor a detailed ex position of their operation. However, the user will find all the information that is normally provided for the safe use and the proper keeping of the machine. Failure to observe the indications in this manual, operational negligence, incorrect use of the machine and the execution of unauthorized modifications, can be grounds for cancellation of the warranty given by the manufacturer to the machine. The manufacturer declines all responsibility for damages due to negligence and failure to comply with the instructions in this manual. For any repairs or revisions involving operations of a certain complexity, contact an authorized Service Center that has specialized staff or directly contact the manufacturer, who is at your complete disposal to provide prompt and accurate technical support and everything that can be useful for the operation and the maximum machine efficiency. This manual must be kept in a safe place to allow its preservation and consultation throughout the lifetime of the machine. In order to develop and upgrade this product, BREVIGLIERI reserve the right to make changes without notice. In case of dispute, the text of the instructions for use, to which reference will be made, shall be exclusively in Italian. Some of the images shown may differ from the machine in your possession: they are shown here only for illustration to explain the operations to be performed.

#### 1.2 WARRANTY

The Manufacturer guarantees brand new products for a period of 12 (twelve) months from the date of delivery. When the machine is delivered, make sure that both it and the accessories are complete and in a perfect condition. Complaints should be presented in writing within 8 (eight) days from receipt of the machine. The warranty merely covers the repair or replacement, free of charge, of those parts which, after thorough examination by the Manufacturer, are recognized as being defective (with the exclusion of tines). Expenses concerning replacement of lubricants, transport costs, customs duties and VAT remain at the purchaser's charge in any case. Replacement or repair of parts under guarantee shall in no case extend the warranty terms. The Manufacturer will not accept returned goods without prior written authorization. The purchaser shall only be able to exercise his rights in relation to the warranty when he has complied with the conditions governing warranty performance, as indicated in the supply contract.

## 1.3 WARRANTY EXCLUSIONS

(Besides the circumstances indicated in the supply contract) the warranty becomes void:

- When the damage can be ascribed to insufficient maintenance.
- When, following repairs made by the user without the Manufacturer's consent or owing to the installation of spurious spare parts, the machine has been subjected to changes and the damage is ascribable to these changes.
- When the machine has been hitched to tractors whose power rating exceeds the value given in the "2.6 Technical specifications" table in this manual.
- When the user has failed to comply with the instructions in this manual. Damage deriving from negligence, carelessness, bad and improper use of the machine or incorrect manoeuvres by the operator are also excluded from the warranty. Removal of the safety devices with which the machine is equipped shall automatically void the warranty and relieve the Manufacturer from all relative liability. The warranty also becomes void if spurious spare parts are used.

Even when covered by the warranty, the machine must be returned Carriage Free.

# 2 GENERAL WARNINGS AND DESCRIPTION OF THE MACHINE

## 2.1 GENERAL SAFETY WARNINGS



## 2.3 OPERATING PRINCIPLE

The machine **MEKFARMER150** rotary harrow consists of a central framework (2 "Fig. 2"), with three-point coupling that hitches to a harrow unit. The machine only operates

when hitched to a tractor with an adequate power rating (see technical specifications for the specific power). The power required to operate the machine is transmitted by the tractor through the driveline (with CE marking) which engages with the central transmission unit (6 "Fig. 2") and operates the various tine rotors (13 "Fig. 2").

### 2.4.2 OPTIONAL (OPT)

Spiked or maxi spiked roller

#### MEKFARMER 150



It can be used on damp, clay soils and in difficult working situations. It does not compact the soil but levels it at the rear of the machine.

#### Cage roller

• This is used for soil of medium consistency and when the degree of humidity is low. It prepares the soil for seeding but does not compact the surface.

#### Packer roller

 This is used to crumble the soil worked by the tines to a further degree and to guarantee a compact surface, optimum for seeding. It has a bearing effect if the seed drill is mounted in a combined configuration. It is excellent for dry and hard soil.

#### Crumbling roller

 Like the packer roller, it it used for further crumbling of the surface clods. It does not compact the soil excessively and leave it levelled. It can also be used as load-bearing roller with a combine seeder.

#### Coil roller

 This type of roller consists of a bar wound as a coil around a central axis. It is particularly recommended for light and sandy soils.




FIG. 3 Position of the decals



## 2.9 VIBRATIONS

During its normal working, the machine does not transmit significant vibrations to the tractor and therefore to the operator. These vibrations are less than  $8.2 \text{ ft/s}^2$  for the operator's upper limbs and less than  $1.6 \text{ ft/s}^2$  for the sitting part of the operator's body.




FIG. 5 Handling machine without roller

Make sure that the zone in which the operations take place is uncluttered and that there is a sufficient "escape route", i.e. a clear and safe zone to which the operators can quickly move if the load should fall.



#### **CAUTION**

When handling with a forklift insert the forks between the blades. Place the forks under the rotor.

Beware of the sharp edges as they can damage the lifting straps.

To lift the machine with roller you have to hitch it in different places: a lift point is indicated on the machine, near

the upper three-point hitch. Hitch the straps on the scraper holder bar too. Check the balance and the positioning of the load on the forks in case of a forklift and of the assembly hook-straps-machine in case of a crane. When handling, loads must not be hoisted no more than 8 inches from the ground




FIG. 6 Handling machine with roller

Lift the machine with the utmost care and move it slowly without jolting on to the truck or railway car. The surface on to which the machine is to be loaded must be perfectly horizontal, to prevent the load from shifting.

If the machine has been placed on a wooden pallet, use a forklift to handle the pallet. The forklift forks must be as distant as possible from each other.

#### 3.2.2 HANDLING ACCESSORIES


Accessories with a weight less than 44 lbs can be handled by a single operator. The rollers must be handled with a crane and lifting straps("Fig. 7"). Fix two hoisting shackles, one on each side. Insert the shackle pin in the hole of the roller holder plate("Fig. 7"). Hitch the lifting straps.

Lift the roller of few centimetres. Check the roller balance



#### **CAUTION**

Crash risk. The roller is fitted on freely rotating supports. Connect a strap to the centre of the roller.

## 3.3 TRANSPORT OF PACKAGING



### CAUTION

Never dispose of the packaging waste in the environment. The disposal of waste must be in compliance with the regulations in force in the country where the machine is installed.

The machine can be delivered wrapped in a plastic film.



## *i* NOTE

UPON DELIVERY, CHECK (VISUALLY WITH THE CARRIER) THE PERFECT CONDITION OF THE PACKAGING. FURNISH PROOF AND REPORT ANY FOUND ANOMALIES TO THE MANUFACTURER.

If the machine must be transported over a long distance, it can be loaded on a truck or railway car.

Once the machine has been moved on to the truck or wagon, make sure that it remains blocked in position.

Fix the machine firmly to the surface on which it rests. After transport and before freeing the machine check the solidity of the packaging and the position of the machine. Remove the fastening systems of the load. Unload the machine following the handling operations.

## 3.4 STORAGE

Storing wrapped machines must be done in places protected from bad weather and sun. Storage time must be limited to the strict minimum; for machine wrapped in plastic film the storage time is 12 months whereas the ones protected with a plastic sheet, storage time must be limited to the minimum (EU or neighbouring countries). For further information regarding storage time and methods contact the Manufacturer After-Sales service. The Manufacturer does not guarantee the condition of the content for periods



of time longer than the recommended ones.

### 4.2 ASSEMBLING THE MACHINE

The machine may be delivered with the roller disassembled from the supports and hitched with iron clamps (1, "Fig. 9") on the machine.





To release the roller and prepare it to be fitted onto the machine proceed as follows:

- Secure the roller with the appropriate hoisting straps having a minimum capacity equal to the roller weight (for weights, see paragraph"3.2.2 Handling accessories").
- Pull the hoisting straps.
- Loosen the screws fixing the clamps (1, "Fig. 9") to the roller.
- Impede the rotation of the scraper holder bar (1).
- Place the roller on the ground with the support plates (2, "Fig. 10") set in the assembly direction.

Loosen the bolts (6, "Fig. 11"). Remove the spacer (7).
Remove the split pin and the upper pin (5). Lower the
arm (4) until it rests onto the lower pin (5). Insert the
upper pin (5) into the first free hole on the arm. Tighten
pins with the split pin.



• Fit the roller unit. Loosen the screws (8, "Fig. 12") of the roller supports to the arm (4).









The machine has been designed for being used by a single operator. During work the operator must be driving the tractor. The machine can work on soils with small stones.

Never use parts of the machine as a ladder to climb up. Never use the control levers or flexible tubes as grips.

Never remove the safety guards when the machine is working, for no reason whatsoever.

Beware of breakage of the blades. Never operate on soils with large stones.

# 5.4 RESIDUAL RISKS AND DANGEROUS ZONES



#### **DANGER**

Danger of being crushed. Zone between machine, tractor and three-point hitch, during the phases of hitching, unhitching, use of the machine and machine stop with the tractor engine on.

Danger of being crushed. Zone between the machine and the ground surface when lowering the machine for work, parking and routine maintenance.

Danger of objects thrown. When operating some objects or stones could be thrown from the rear side of the machine. Keep the machine at a 50 yards distance from passers-by, roads, paths, inhabited areas etc...

Danger of tilting over. Never park or stop on sloping ground.

Danger of being burnt. As a secondary effect, lengthy use of the machine can cause the gearbox and of some parts of the hydraulic circuit to heat. Never touch these hot parts during or immediately after use.

Read carefully the instructions manual of the PTO shaft attached to the PTO shaft itself. If there is any doubt regarding its working, if it is without any guards and is worn or broken, replace it with a new PTO shaft marked «CE» having the same specifications.





- Protective plate for preventing access to the blades(5).



### 5.6 OPERATING

# 5.6.1 HITCHING THE MACHINE TO THE TRACTOR



#### **DANGER**

Danger of being crushed. Keep hands and feet away from the blades and the machine.



#### **CAUTION**

The hitching and unhitching operations of the machine from the tractor must be carried out on stable and horizontal ground.

During the hitching and unhitching operations, never stand between the machine and the tractor.



#### **CAUTION**

Hitching a machine to a tractor means a different distribution of weights on the axis. Check the stability of the machine-tractor assembly. Observe the maximum indicated weight on the tractor axles.

Hitch the machine to a tractor with appropriate HP.

Before hitching or unhitching the machine from the three-point hitch, lock the control lever of the power-lift.

The class of the machine's coupling pins must correspond to that of the power lift hitch.

- Make sure that there are no objects, bystanders and/ or animals in the immediate vicinity of the machine and that the PTO is disengaged.
- Back up the tractor towards the machine. Drive the tractor near to the implement with caution and adapt the height of the lift links to the height of the hitching pins.
- Turn off the tractor and put the parking brake on.
- Move the power-lift bars to the lower hitches ("Fig. 24"). Insert the attachment pins (1). Fasten the pins with the trigger pins (2) part of standard equipment.



 Move the tie-rod of the power-lift to the three-point hitch ("Fig. 25"). Set the tie rod so that the machine stays on the ground. Insert the attachment pin (1). Lock the pin with the trigger split pin (2), part of standard equipment.



- Lock the power lift bars with the relative chains and parallel idlers on the tractor. This must be done to prevent
  the machine from swinging sideways
- Start the tractor. Start lifting the machine from the ground. Turn off the tractor. Remove the keys from the dashboard.
- Set the arms of the tractor power-lift so that the machine is levelled. The blades have to be at the same distance from the ground on both sides of the machine.

#### 5.6.2 SETTING LOWER ATTACHMENTS POINTS

- Remove the spilt pin (1, "Fig. 26").
- Take out the pin (3).
- Take out and rotate at 180° the tractor hitch (2).
- · Insert again the hitch into its seat.
- Insert the pin (3).
- Fasten the pin with the spilt pin (1).

The hitch can also be fitted into the hole (4).



## 5.6.3 INSTALLING THE PTO SHAFT



#### **DANGER**

Installing and uninstalling the PTO shaft must always



be done when the tractor is off.



#### **CAUTION**

When hitched to the tractor, the machine can only be operated with the driveline complete with shields fixed by their chains. Keep well away from the spinning driveline.

Prevent the shields from turning by means of the relative chains and always read the operation and maintenance manual supplied with the driveline

Only used a PTO shaft marked «CE», equipped with guards and locking chains.

- Fit the driveline into the machine's power take-off and make sure that it is perfectly locked in the correct position.
- Fit the driveline into the tractor's power take-off and make sure that it is perfectly locked in the correct position. Make sure that the shield is free to turn.
- Fasten the shield with the relative chain. Remove the support from the driveline (4 Fig. 1) and fix it on the relative hook.
- Lift and lower the machine to check if the length of the PTO shaft is correct.



IF THE PTO SHAFT IS TOO LONG YOU CAN SHORTEN IT FOL-LOWING THE INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN IN THE INSTRUCTION MANUAL OF THE PTO SHAFT.

IF YOU LOSE THE PTO SHAFT INSTRUCTION MANUAL, CONTACT THE PTO SHAFT MANUFACTURER OR BREVIGLIERI AFTER-SA-LES SERVICE.

#### 5.6.4 HYDRAULIC CONNECTION (OPT)

There is a hydraulic connection on models with hydraulic setting of the roller position.



# 5.6.5 INSTALLING HYDRAULIC SEEDER LINKAGE (OPT)



- Once the frame is fitted on the machine, make sure that
  to lift the seeder with the seeds, the overall weight of
  the combine does not exceed the one indicated in the
  instruction and maintenance manual of the tractor.
- Make sure that the coupling, and the working of the seeder when lifted, is correct and that there is no inference with the hydraulic tubes.
- Make sure that the mechanical parts of the seeder do not interfere with the machine roller or with the machine itself.
- When transporting the machine on public roads, make sure that no blunt object sticks out from the contour of the machine.
- Make sure that the visual signals at the rear of the combine machine can be seen properly or otherwise proceed as required by the Highway code of the country where the machine is being used.



## CAUTION

During transport on public roads the seeder hopper must always be emptied of any product.

# 5.6.6 SEED DRILL HYDRAULIC CONNECTION (OPT)

After installing the linkage to the machine, to check proper operating of the lift, connect the linkage hydraulic tube to the tractor PTO and put pressure so as to allow the activation of the structure on the machine. Carry out this operation load-less two or three times making sure that everything works properly and that there is no mechanical or hydraulic hindrances. Before carrying out these operations, make sure there is no-one near the machine. The descent of the seeder linkage is spontaneous when there is no pressure in the system as the cylinder is at single effect. It is equipped with a check valve in case of a sudden



#### **CAUTION**

When required by road regulations, on-road transport must be carried out with reflex reflectors, flashing lights, slow vehicle and protruding load signals. Put these signals on the rear side of machine in a well visible manner. When transporting at night or with poor visibility install warning and side marker lights.

It is absolutely forbidden to transport persons or animals on the machine.

When driving round bends with and without the machine, take care of the centrifugal force exercised when the center of gravity is in a different position.

Set the control lever of the tractor's hydraulic lifting control in the locked position when driving on the roads with the machine raised.

When transporting the machine disengage PTO and disconnect the PTO shaft from the tractor.

The machine must be raised at least 16 inches from the ground for road transport.

Ensure that the tractor-machine assembly is stable.

The following expressions must be observed to ensure that the tractor-machine assembly is stable:



#### **SETTING WORKING DEPTH** 5.6.8



### **DANGER**

Park the machine on a horizontal and stable surface. Disconnect PTO. Turn off the tractor. Put the parking brake on.



### NOTE

CHANGING THE POSITION OF THE REAR ROLLER IMPLIES A NEW ADJUSTEMENT OF THE LEVELLING BAR.

The adjustment of the machine working depth depends on the position of the rear roller.

#### Setting with side pins

This solution ("Fig. 31"), not only permits depth adjustment, but also having a floating rear roller (ideal when there are stones). When the roller is lowered, working depth decreases.



The machine is on the ground. The roller arm is between the pins (1) and (2).

To lower the roller and reduce the working depth:

- Remove the pin (2).
- Activate the machine power-lift and lift the machine.
- Move pin (2) into the lowest hole.
- Move pin (1) into the lowest hole.

To lift the roller and increase the working depth:

- Remove the pin (1).
- Activate the tractor power-lift and lower the machine.
   The roller holder arm goes up.
- Move pin (1) into the highest hole.
- Move pin (2) into the highest hole: the roller must not swing too much when operating.
- Lock the pins: insert the retainer into the nearest hole.

#### Setting with screw jacks (OPT)

This solution ("Fig. 32") requires two screw jacks at the ends of the machine and adjustable by means of a graduated rod. When the roller is raised, working depth increases. When the roller is lowered, working depth decreases



### Setting with hydraulic cylinders (OPT)

This solution ("Fig. 33") for adjusting work depth with hydraulic control cylinders can be implemented from the driving seat, by means of the hydraulic mechanism which controls the two hydraulic cylinders that regulate the rear rollers (8 Fig. 1) thus determining the work depth. Both hydraulic cylinders feature stop valves. When the roller is raised, working depth increases. When the roller is lowered, working depth decreases.



#### 5.6.9 SETTING THE SCRAPERS



### **CAUTION**

Danger of being crushed. Do not put your finger between the scraper and the roller.

Scrapers allow to free the roller from clods.

The first setting is carried out on the roller scraper bar:

- Loosen nut (2, "Fig. 34").
- Loosen nuts (1) until the scraper is at the desired distance from the roller.
- Tighten all the nuts.

The second setting is carried out on the scraper:

- Loosen nut(4).
- Bring the scraper(3) close to the roller.
- Tighten nut (4).



#### 5.6.10 STARTING WORK



#### **DANGER**

Before starting the machine, make sure that the safety devices are in perfect condition.

Never start the machine if there is a suspected mechanical failure. Contact the technical assistance centre.



Before starting work, get familiar with the control devices and their functions,

Check the working area so as to be confident with the soil and check for any possible excessive slopes. Make sure that there are no objects in the area that could be picked up and thrown at a distance. Clear the area of these objects. Check constantly that there are no people, children or pets in the working range of the machine.

Check the rpm rate before engaging the power take-off. Do not switch the 540 rpm rate with the 1000 rpm one.

It is absolutely forbidden to linger within the range of action of the machine when this is operating.

It is absolutely forbidden to get between the tractor and machine while the engine is running and the driveline engaged.

Never engage PTO when the tractor engine is off. Danger of sudden movements when restarting the tractor.

The operator must never leave the driver's seat when the tractor engine is on and/or the machine is running.

Disengage PTO when the machine is not used.

Lower the machine to bring the blades close to the ground, without touching it. Engage PTO. Lower the machine gradually and bring it into working position. The tractor power-lift must be completely lowered.

Begin work with the PTO at full rate. Gradually dig the implement into the ground. Do not depress the accelerator pedal too much with the PTO engaged. To break up the soil to the required degree, you must consider several factors, i.e.:

- the nature of the soil (medium consistency, sandy, clayey, etc.)
- · the work depth
- · the ground speed of the tractor
- · optimum machine adjustment

Soil crumbling is obtained at a low tractor ground speed, with the rear bar lowered and the blades spinning at 300 rpm. Besides holding back the clods already broken up by the blades, the rear bar also obtains a well levelled and uniform surface after the soil has been worked. Adjust the roller (8 Fig. 1) to suit the degree to which the soil must be crumbled, engage the PTO and begin to move forward with the tractor, progressively lowering the implement. Cover a short distance, then check to make sure that the work depth, soil crumbling and ground levelling operations have been carried out in the required way.



### **CAUTION**

The speed of the tractor when the machine is operation must not exceed 3-4 mph or components could be broken or damaged.

Always disengage PTO when lifting the machine to prevent the PTO shaft working at a too big angle (see PTO shaft instruction manual).

Lift the machine from the ground when working in curve or in reverse.

# 5.6.11 SETTING THE POSITION OF THE REAR BAR



#### **DANGER**

Park the machine on a horizontal and stable surface. Disengage PTO. Turn the tractor off. Put the parking brake on.



#### **CAUTION**

Danger of breakage. Never lower the rear bar more than the length of the blades. The rear bar must never touch the ground.

To level and crumble the soil to a greater degree, the harrow has a levelling bar (1, "Fig. 35") positioned behind the tines. It can be adjusted in height by means of crank screws (2, "Fig. 35"). Make the adjustments by keeping the bar at the same distance from the soil as far as possible. Avoid using the bar at depth as it could be damaged. It is recommended to start working with the levelling bar in a high position. Set gradually the position of the bar by rotating the crank(3) until the desired position is reached.



### 5.6.12 SETTING THE SIDE SHIELD



#### **DANGER**

Danger of being caught up, being cut or having objects thrown. The side shield must cover completely the part of the blade which comes out of the ground.

After setting the position of the roller, set the height of the side shields from the ground.





Loosen screws (2, "Fig. 36"). Raise and lower the side shield (1). Tighten screws (2).

The side shield with connecting rods does not need any setting.

#### **5.6.13 STOPPING**

At the end of work the operator must:

- · Park the machine on a horizontal and stable surface.
- · Disengage the tractor PTO.
- · Lower the machine to the ground.
- Stop the tractor and engage the parking brake.
- Make sure that all parts of the machine have come to a standstill.

Only after the above mentioned operations have been carried out may the operator leave the tractor unattended.

# 5.6.14 PROCEDURES IN CASE OF ACCIDENTS OR MECHANICAL FAILURES

In case of accident you must always:

- Turn the tractor off. Put the parking brake on.
- Move the injured person away and check their conditions. According to the seriousness of the accident call the casualty department.
- If the person has caught up their clothes in parts of the machine cut the clothes to free them.
- · Inform the competent authorities.

In case of shutdown of the machine or following any malfunction or breakdown, always do as follows:

- · Turn the tractor off. Put the parking brake on.
- Identify the cause of the shutdown or the malfunction. According to their assigned tasks the operator can carried out simple operations of removing caught up material. For disassembling the machine contact the Technical assistance centre.
- After returning to the normal efficiency conditions you can restart.

In case of smoke coming out or obvious signs of fire in any point of the machine proceed as follows:

- Turn the tractor off. Put the parking brake on.
- Put out the fire using only CO<sub>2</sub> extinguishers.
- To reactivate the machine contact the Technical assistance centre.

# 5.6.15 UNHITCHING THE MACHINE FROM THE TRACTOR



#### DANGER

Park the machine on a horizontal and stable surface. Disengage PTO. Turn off the tractor. Take the key out of the dashboard.



#### **CAUTION**

Danger of being hit and crushed. Before disconnecting the machine from the tractor power-lift check that the machine is stable on the ground.

- Check that there are no foreign bodies in the parking area of the machine.
- Move to the parking area of the machine.
- Turn off the tractor.
- Lower completely the machine to the ground.
- Turn off the tractor engine and apply the parking brake.
- with the tractor stopped, its engine off and the components at a complete standstill, operate the levers of the hydraulic circuit so as to relieve the pressure from inside the pipes. This will allow you to re-connect the quick couplings with greater ease.

#### ▶ **OPT** Disconnect the quick couplings

- Pull out the PTO shaft from the tractor PTO and place it on its support.
- · Disconnect the top link rod.
- · Disconnect the power lift links.
- · Switch on the tractor engine and move away.



ONCE UNHITCHED FROM THE TRACTOR, THE MACHINE MUST BE KEPT IN A DRY PLACE, SHELTERED FROM ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS.

PREVENT ANIMALS, CHILDREN OR UNAUTHORIZED PEOPLE FROM FREE ACCESS TO THE MACHINE.

#### 5.6.16 PREPARING FOR STORAGE

At the end of the working season or if the machine is to remain idle for a long period of time, proceed as follows:

- Wash the machine and most of all wash off fertilizers and chemical products and dry it.
- Carefully check the machine and replace any damaged or worn parts if necessary.
- Fully tighten all the screws and bolts, and particularly the ones fixing the blades.
- Thoroughly grease the machine and then cover it with a tarpaulin and store it in a dry place.

### **6 MAINTENANCE**

## 6.1 SAFETY WARNINGS



READING THIS CHAPTER IMPLIES THAT, FOR A SAFE USE OF THE MACHINE, WHAT IS CONTAINED IN THE PARAGRAPH HAS BEEN FULLY UNDERSTOOD "2.1 GENERAL SAFETY WARNINGS".

LOWER RUNNING COSTS AND A LONGER MACHINE LIFE DEPEND ON CONSTANT OBSERVANCE OF THESE INSTRUCTIONS.

SERVICING FREQUENCIES INDICATED IN THIS MANUAL ARE INDICATIVE AND REFER TO NORMAL WORKING CONDITIONS. ANYHOW THEY MAY VARY ACCORDING TO THE TYPE OF USE, WHETHER THE ENVIRONNEMENT IS DUSTY OR NOT, SEASONAL FACTORS ETC. SERVIVING OPERATIONS MUST OBVIOUSLY BE CARRIED OUT MORE FREQUENTLY IN HEAVIER DUTY CONDITIONS. AS TIME PASSES IT IS NECESSARY TO INCREASE THE FREQUENCY OF THE ROUTINE MAINTENANCE OPERATIONS.



#### **DANGER**

Observe the safety instructions, the intervals and the procedures indicated in the routine maintenance.

Proceed with maintenance and cleaning operations always after putting the machine in a safety position (see "6.2 Machine in safety position").

Leave at least a one meter space around the machine when performing maintenance operations.

Before starting the machine, after repairs, for testing, check that no-one stands or passes in the working zone of the blades. Always clamp the raised component to prevent it from falling.

Never work alone under the machine or when carrying out repair or maintenance operations.

It is not proper that, in case of breakdown or malfunction, operators not properly trained and qualified, try to find out the causes of the malfunction or the failure.



#### **CAUTION**

Never carry out welding, grinding and drilling operations without prior authorization and instructions from the Manufacturer.

### 6.2 MACHINE IN SAFETY POSITION

Park the machine on a horizontal and stable surface.

Disengage PTO. Turn the tractor off. Put the parking brake on. Remove the keys from the dashboard.

Remove the PTO shaft from the tractor PTO. Place the PTO shaft on its support.

Unhitch the machine from the tractor power-lift unit.

- Check for the presence or the wear and tear of the PTO guards.
- Check the wear and tear of the PTO shaft guards.

## **DANGER**


Before carrying out maintenance regarding cutting blades put the machine in a safety position (see "6.2 Machine in safety position").

When servicing or replacing blades with the lifted machine, put stands under the machine. Prevent risk of being crushed if the machine falls.

The blades fitted on the implement are suitable for soil of a normal consistency. If the blades should accidentally bend (or break) during work, they must be immediately replaced. Make sure that the new blades are mounted in exactly the same positions as the old ones. If several blades must be replaced, it is advisable to demount and remount them one at a time in order to avoid positioning errors. The sharp side of the blades must point towards the direction in which the blade rotor turns.

To replace blades, put the machine in a safety position (see "6.2 Machine in safety position"):

- Unhitch the machine from the tractor (see "5.6.15 Unhitching the machine from the tractor").
- Lift the machine (see "3.2 Handling").
- Put two bearing stands at the sides of the machine (for machine weight, see "3.2 Handling"). Place the machine on the stands. Do not remove the lifting hook.
- Place yourself under the machine.
- Remove the collar clamp.
- Loosen the two bolts (2, "Fig. 37").
- Remove the block (1).
- Remove the blade (3) sidewards.
- Replace the worn blade with a new one.



To fit back the blade do the same procedure in reverse order.



THE BLADES ARE RIGHT AND LEFT. CHECK THE DIRECTION OF ROTATON OF THE ROTOR AND FIT THE BLADES PROPERLY.

TO REMOVE THE OTHER BLADE BRING IT TO THE OPENING WHERE THE COLLAR CLAMP IS TIGHTENED. INSERT A LEVER BETWEEN THE TWO BLADES. ROTATE FORCEFULLY UNTIL YOU BRING THE BLOCK OF THE OTHER BLADE IN FRONT OF THE OPENING, ON THE ROTOR.





#### **CAUTION**

Danger of falling. When rotating the rotor with a lever, the blades could hit the stands. Leave the machine hitched to the lifting hook. Proceed carefully and plan all the working phases.



#### **CAUTION**

The bolts that holding the tools must have their heads on the side of the tool, and the nut on the side of the support. Comply the driving torque value.



## 6.3.11 CHANGING THE ROTATING SPEED OF THE BLADES

Park the machine on a horizontal and stable surface. Disengage PTO. Turn off the tractor. Put the parking brake one. Remove keys from the dashboard.



#### **CAUTION**

Danger of hot surfaces. The gearbox can reach very high temperatures. Wait for the parts and the oil in the gearbox to cool down.

Dispose of used oil in compliance with the directives of anti-pollution laws.



## *i* NOTE

TAKE CARE NOT TO MISTAKE GEARS AS YOU CANNOT FIT GEARS WITH TORQUES DIFFERENT FROM THE ONES INDICATED IN THE TABLE.

The tine rotors can spin at various speeds, depending on the gear pairs mounted in the gearbox. It also allows the soil to be broken up to various degrees depending on its nature, the amount of moisture it contains, the ground speed, etc.

Only use the pairs indicated in the table:



The faster the rotors spin, the more the soil is crumbled, but tractor power draw and blade wear will also be greater. You are advised to use the lowest rotation speed able to work the soil in the required way.

To change speed of the blades do as follows:

- · Remove the guard of the rear PTO.
- Loosen screws (5, "Fig. 39") and nuts (2). Remove the cap (6).
- · Take out the gears from the shafts.
- Exchange the two gears or insert another couple of gears
- Fit back the cap (6). Tighten bolts and nuts.
- Fit back the PTO guard.



6.3.12 CHECK/CHANGE OIL IN THE GEARBOX



## Operator

To check the oil level in the gearbox loosen the filler cap with dipstick (3, "Fig. 39"). Check the level with the dipstick. If necessary fill with oil up to the right level.

To change oil:

- Place a basin under the oil drain plug (1).
- · Loosen the oil drain plug.
- Loosen the level indicator cap (3). Drain all the oil contained in the gearbox.
- Tighten the oil drain plug (1).
- · Fill the gearbox with oil.
- Loosen the level indicator cap (1).
- Loosen the filler cap (4).
- · Fill with oil up to level.
- Tighten the filler cap (4) and the level indicator cap (3).

For the type of oil to use see paragraph "6.4.2 Recommended lubricants".

## 6.3.13 CHECK/CHANGE OIL IN THE FLAT PAN

Loosen the oil filler cap on the trough (1, "Fig. 40"). The proper level is 1cm under the upper surface of the rotor gear.



To replace oil in the trough remove the side shield on the left or the right side.

- · Remove unit with the side shield.



- Place a basin under the oil drain plug (3, "Fig. 42").
- · Loosen the oil drain plug.



## 6.4 LUBRICATION



#### **DANGER**

Proceed with maintenance and cleaning operations only after putting the machine in a safety position (see "6.2 Machine in safety position").

Keep lubricants out of children reach.



#### **CAUTION**

Lubricate and grease all the required points.

Read carefully warnings and caution on the lubricant containers.

Wash hands thoroughly after use.

Dispose of used oil in compliance with the directives of anti-pollution laws.



ALWAYS USE THE SAME TYPE OF RECOMMENDED OIL WHEN TOPPING UP OR CHANGING.

#### 6.4.1 LUBRICATION POINTS

The servicing frequencies indicated in this manual refer to normal conditions of use in normal environment. If the machine is used in more severe environmental conditions servicing operations will have to be carried out more frequently. Before injecting lubricating grease into the lubricator, carefully clean the grease nipples to prevent mud, dust or foreign bodies from mixing with the grease thus reducing or even annul the lubricating effect.

- Grease gun on screw jack (1, "Fig. 43").
- Roller support grease gun (2).



### 6.5 CLEANING



Operator



### **DANGER**

In case of material clogging between blades, never try to clean the machine when running. First put the machine in a safety position (see "6.2 Machine in safety position"). Wait until all the parts of the machine are completely still and perform cleaning carefully.



#### **CAUTION**

The decals on the machine must always be visible. Keep decals clean. Replace decals if they are worn. Ask the Manufacturer for spare parts (see "8.1 List of spare parts critical for safety").

Using pressure washers or air guns can detach decals.





### ALWAYS WEAR GOGGLES TO PROTECT YOUR **EYESIGHT**

Clean off the machine of fertilizers and chemicals and dry it. Only use commercial inflammable and non toxic solvents.
